It was felt necessary that meetings of scientists who will lead the work at sea in the co-operative programmes should be able to meet early in 1961 at the latest at places in the Indian Ocean area, possibly during some experimental trip for the study of scientific problems mentioned above. It is not possible as yet to give the names of the members of the working parties nor the places where they will meet. Action will be taken by the Chairman of SCOR, Dr. Humphrey, and by the Co-ordinator International Indian Ocean Expedition, Robert G. Snider.

After the Helsinki SCOR Meeting during the General Assembly of the I.U.C.G., it was felt that besides the co-operation with WMO on behalf of general advice for synoptic and climatological services there is an urgent need for co-operation with individual scientists for the study of special problems e.g. energy exchange between atmosphere and ocean; temperature and humidity gradients and wind-profiles; radio sondes for the study of the wind circulation. These scientists, say 4 or 5, should meet, too.

It was further agreed that the 18 SCOR members should have a meeting in India in about fall 1961. Proposals about the place of this meeting will be made by the Chairman of SCOR after consultation with Dr. Panikkar.
