

## Call for Applications for an Early-Career Scientist to Join the SCOR Executive Committee

The Scientific Committee on Oceanic Research (SCOR) is an international non-governmental organization whose vision is to advance international ocean research, within and across disciplines, by stimulating international cooperation in ocean sciences. SCOR is governed by an Executive Committee that currently includes 11 members: (1) six officers elected from among national SCOR committees, (2) three presidents (or their designees) of ocean science relevant associations under SCOR's parent organization (the International Council for Science), (3) two co-opted members appointed by the Executive Committee to add expertise to the committee, one of which is represented by an early career scientist. The call for applications for an Early-Career Scientist to join the SCOR Executive Committee is now open. The ECS in the SCOR EC will help reaching out to the broader early-career community and get it involved into SCOR activities.

**Position Description:** The early-career scientist (ECS) will have the same responsibilities as other SCOR Executive Committee members (see <https://scor-int.org/scor/about/officers/job-descriptions/>). The duties of SCOR Executive Committee Members require a few hours each week for responding to emails and reviewing documents, and is expected to attend the SCOR Annual Meeting each year they are on the executive, with the understanding that the 2020 Annual Meeting, presently scheduled for October 2020, may end up being held virtually depending on travel restrictions. SCOR will pay for the travel costs related to the SCOR meeting. The term of appointment will be for two years.

**Requirements:** Applicants should be no more than 10 years from PhD not counting time for family leaves, and should be affiliated to an ocean science organization, institution, or government agency. Applicants should have good communication skills in English, both speaking and writing.

**Application and Review Process:** Applicants should submit by email (1) the appended form, (2) a short CV (maximum 3 pages), and (3) two reference letters by the 17<sup>th</sup> of July to the SCOR Secretariat ([secretariat@scor-int.org](mailto:secretariat@scor-int.org)). The SCOR Executive Committee will select a candidate by the 28<sup>th</sup> of August. The selected candidate is expected to attend the SCOR 2020 Annual Meeting in October, which is conditioned to global travel conditions. If travel is still restricted, the meeting will be done virtually.
