

2022 Elections of new SCOR Officers

Summary

The Nomination Committee recommends the following 'slate' for election for the 2022 SCOR Meeting:

SCOR Vice-Presidents: Stefano ALIANI (Italy), Bradley MORAN (USA) and Ilka PEEKEN (Germany) each to serve until 2024.

SCOR secretariat: Peter CROOT (Ireland) to serve until 2026.

In generating this slate, we achieve a rather good balance of nationality, gender and discipline across the SCOR Executive as a whole.

Thus, the new SCOR Executive going forward from 2022 would comprise:

Process in detail

In 2022, the SCOR Executive (EXEC) requested a Nomination Committee (NC) comprising Marie-Alexandrine Sicre (Past SCOR Chair, France) to serve as Chair with Peter Burkill (UK), Samuel Mafwila (Namibia) and Constanza Ricaurte Villota (Colombia) to generate a slate of new SCOR Officers to replace those retiring. The NC issued a call to SCOR National Committees on the 6 of March which was opened until the 24 of June resulting in the following nominations that were received chronologically: German SCOR nominated Ilka Peeken to serve a first term as Vice-President, Italian SCOR nominated Stefano Aliani to serve a second term as Vice-President, USA SCOR nominated Bradley Moran to serve a second term as Vice-President, and Ireland SCOR nominated Peter Croot to serve as Secretary.

The NC welcomed the nominations and confirmed that each nominee was eligible to serve. They considered the gender balance of 6 males and 5 females on the EXEC as a whole was equable. The NC considered the disciplinary balance was acceptable, though somewhat biased to Biology; they re-iterate the shortage of hard-rock marine geology experience on the EXEC. The NC felt that the geographical balance across the different continents was acceptable although they noted the absence of South American representation.
